PROGRAMS

ADULT SERVICES

Social, Recreation, and Respite (SRR)

A wide variety of educational, cultural, and recreational activities year-round that develop self-esteem and social skills, and increase community involvement.

Adult Education

Educational sessions on a wide variety of topics such as health and wellness, self-care, safety, finances, healthy relationships, and independent living.

ADVOCACY

People First Fox Cities

A self-advocacy group that encourages and trains individuals to speak up and advocate for themselves.

Individual Advocacy Support

Information and connections to community resources.

TRAUMATIC BRAIN INJURY SUPPORT

Connection, Education, and Support

Support group meetings, resource navigation, and community outreach provide information and support to those who have been impacted by a brain injury.

COMMUNITY EDUCATION

Adult Presentations

Training sessions and presentations that raise awareness on disability-related topics such as employment, creating inclusive environments, sensitivity and etiquette, and safety/first responder protocol.

Youth Presentations

Provide disability and diversity awareness to youth through the use of Kids on the Block puppets (elementary school) and interactive presentations (middle and high school).

SPECIAL OLYMPICS

Bowling, Basketball, Power Lifting, Aquatics, Track & Field, Softball, Tee-Ball, and Bocce

CAMPS

Onaway, Adult Fall Weekend Camp

Provide campers with unique opportunities to learn social and life skills while enjoying the classic camp experience.

FAMILY SERVICES

Social Activities
